Bidding on Hodges Estate Rifles

There are three guns in the Hodges estate that are available for bids. The bidding process will be done through closed/sealed bids. To bid on any one of the three rifles you must:

- 1. Include the rifle number (1, 2 or 3), your name, address and phone number, and the amount you want to bid on the gun on an individual piece of paper.
- Put this individual piece of paper in a sealed envelope. Put this envelope in another and address and mail the outside envelope to: John Way, President, BTRPC, 8509 SW Abalone St., South Beach, OR 97366.
- 3. Only one bid will be accepted from each person for each individual gun.
- 4. Upon receipt of your bid, the date and time will be indicated on the outside of the enclosed envelope. Outside envelopes will be opened and destroyed.
- 5. These closed bids will not be opened until the estate has been finalized. Unfortunately, we can not give you a date at this point in time. (However, the end is nearing for the closing of the estate.)
- 6. If these instructions are not followed, the bid will be considered null and void, and destroyed.
- 7. The winning bid will be determined by the date and time, and the dollar bid itself.
- 8. The highest bidder will have 30 days to pay for the gun and pick it up once notified.
- 9. If the highest bidder does not pay for the gun and pick it up within 30 days of notification, the second highest bidder will be notified.
- 10. All funds are to be paid directly to Big Timber Rifle and Pistol Club.
